
As we go forward into 2024, I thank you all for your continued support and hope you enjoy your membership with this wonderful club.

Registrar – Susan McHugh

As of 31 December 2023, there were 135 active members, a decrease of 8 from the number of active members reported at close of 2022.

Sixty-nine (69) members have renewed their membership for 2024 with the incentive of a free membership for those who renewed before the end of 2023. A total of 84 members have renewed their 2024 membership at the time of report submission.

Throughout the course of the year, we have new swimmers trialling and the majority of these took up memberships and enjoyed the training sessions on offer. The club promoted the Let's Swim Together Campaign in November and had several swimmers coming along for a trial swim.

One of my favourite events for club participation is the Winter Solstice, a fiercely competitive event between the WA Masters Clubs. It is always a great bonding experience and brings us all together.

And go Westcoast Masters for retaining the cup from 2022 for another year!



Coaching Co-ordinator – Wayne Dohmen

Previous years presented the Coaching Coordinator role with a number of challenges including covid related venue closures and social distancing restrictions. My fourth year has been no different with the disruption of HBF Arena closing its doors indefinitely during mid 2023.

With half our training sessions closed, the challenge was to maintain Club momentum by communicating to all members about changes and providing alternate swim opportunities for members to gather and contribute to the ethos of fun, friendship and fitness.

Craigie Leisure Centre management allocated extra lanes to Westcoast from November to April 2024 and to date this has been working well in conjunction with Sorrento and Mullaloo Beaches as fill ins. Further arrangements are necessary from April onwards as Craigie have alerted us to current lane allocations being in jeopardy from April 2024 onwards.

Commencing January 2024, Masters Swimming Australia (MSA) and its insurers introduce new conditions applicable to Masters Club training sessions. The MSA identify a difference in terms of those

who are an accredited Masters Swimming Club Coach and those who volunteer to assist on pool deck without accreditation.

Our Club President has received written communication from Masters Swimming WA to confirm that strategies put in place by our committee and qualified masters coaches will enable our Club to continue with volunteers' poolside whilst conforming with new MSA conditions.

Saturday mornings continue to attract over 60 swimmers, making it a difficult task to entertain everyone in a meaningful way. Choosing the correct program that assists with managing the vast numbers in each lane is also very important. Caryn Kiellor is a very important contributor to Saturday mornings because without her affable presence and most valued coaching experience, the task of coordinating over sixty swimmers on a Saturday morning would be so much more difficult.

With Club membership now in the vicinity of 130 swimmers, it remains a challenge to find a happy medium by which all swimmers of varying experience and talents benefit from their training and continue within the Masters Swimming ethos of Fun, Friendship and Fitness. Maintaining variety and interest is an important element whilst being mindful of the diversity of swimmers, all seeking their own experience in swimming and achieving personal goals.

It is pleasing to see so many experienced long-term members continuing to engage with our Club as a way to enjoy their swimming as a healthy approach to life. Another high point is witnessing many new members, from diverse demographics, entering events for the first time and being fully supported by our experienced cohort.

On a finishing note, I want to take this opportunity to express once again my sincere thanks to our volunteer coaches and pool deck assistants over the past 4 years. Their energy and willingness to play an important part in making our Club work so very well is worthy of special mention.
